Macoon, Ga., Aug. 16.—Coming as an aftermath to the famous "Jim Danson" attempted lynching case, John T. Stanley, a deputy sheriff who was recently by members of a mob on May 12, while defending the Wilkinson county jail, last week, (July 13) was indicted for \$20,000 in the United States District Court against a grand jury of the Wilkinson county men, whom he alleged were members of the mob.

This damage suit, one of the most unique and bizarre to be heard, is the first of its kind ever filed in a practical application of the principle of the bitterly debated "lynch law" in the United States Senate, and the outcome of the suit will interest the people of the ordinary citizen.

The Senate Judiciary Committee in 1961 reported the bill, but the House changed from the form as passed by the Senate. The bill was amended so that it shall be charged in the indictment that the defendant "knowingly" migrated to the United States, which the State attorneys did not want. There was also a sufficient dilution in the apprehension of the bill by the teachers. The change greatly strengthened the bill, and the House passed it as to its constitutionality. "The committee has devoted much time and earnest thought to the consideration of the bill, and the result of the conclusion that as amended the bill is a measure of the highest importance to the Negro people of the United States."

Calloway of Tuskegee stated that the Alabama Association of Colored Teachers has an enrollment of 1500 teachers a year, through the assistance of Julius Rosenwald Fund, \$154,000 of Negro school buildings constructed. The entire Negro school-building campaign in Alabama has netted 235 Negro schools, erected at a cost of \$400,000. At this amount, Negroes have received 25 percent of the money in seven Negro summer schools, Alabama 3000 teachers. S. Grawley of Jackson, Miss., stated that his state had completed

At Mount Bayou, a negro metropolis, the colored people, within a radius of 25 square miles voted a mass of \$110,000, and erected a modern, fireproof, equipped building. At Little Rock, the town of about 10,000 people, 3 were erected a \$75,000 Negro building. Mississippi has committed itself to the policy of financing education of the colored people. Mississippi is now conducting summer schools for 3000 colored youths. During the past year there were built 100 new schools for the colored schools at a cost of \$400,000. Indiana has a population of 690,000 negroes. There are however, 90 schools for the colored population, which is 10 per cent of the total population. New children of the 32,000 are in regular daily attendance in Virginia schools. Va. now
