Your office repeatedly stated that our operations were not affected in any way and that was flat out false, but through it all the men and women of the Police and Fire Departments were here to serve and protect the citizens and visitors of Dallas.

The city manager's office was warned in the past few years that the systems in place in Dallas were not sufficient and susceptible to attack and still nothing was done to both protect the city and its employees.

The Dallas Fire Fighters Association and the Dallas Police Association are demanding that the City of Dallas purchase identity theft protection for all our members for a period of five years at no cost to the member. We feel that this is necessary and the least the city can do to insure our personal financial information is not compromised.
