## **SUBJECT Ad Hoc Committee on Legislative Affairs**

Providing meaningful property tax relief for Dallas residents is one of my top three priorities as we look to build for Dallas' future. Without it, residents may choose or be forced to forgo the opportunity to live and work in our great city.

Right now, there is a critical opportunity to advocate for meaningful property tax relief on behalf of Dallas residents at our Texas State Capitol. As I am sure you are aware, Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick and House Speaker Dade Phelan announced this morning that they reached a deal that will deliver "the biggest property tax cut in Texas history." It is essential for our city to actively engage in ongoing discussions about this bill in Austin and demonstrate our full support.
