BACKGROUND

- ❑ DART is comprised of 13 member cities: Addison, Carrollton, Cockrell Hill, Dallas, Farmers Branch, Garland, Glenn Heights, Highland Park, Irving, Richardson, Rowlett, Plano, and University Park.
- ❑ DART receives half of our sales tax revenue or 1 cent. Farmers Branch contribution is approximately **\$22-23M annually**.
- ❑ FY 2024 - DART estimated 870.8 million dollars in total sales tax revenue.

CONCERNS

- ❑ Shared concerns among the member cities:
 - ❑ Reliability, quality, and fiscal responsibility
 - ❑ Cleanliness
 - ❑ Safety
- ❑ Farmers Branch contributes **\$22-23 million** annually to the DART system:
 - ❑ Are our taxpayers receiving a value corresponding to their investment? **OR,**
 - ❑ Are we subsidizing the system for other cities?

ACTION ITEMS



RESOLUTION 2024-116

To support reducing sales and use tax contributions to DART from the existing one-cent to three-quarters of a cent.



2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Lobby at the 2025 Legislative Session.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

- ❑ After a reduction is voted on by the DART Board, an election is called in each of the member cities to allow the taxpayers to decide how to reallocate the one-quarter of a cent ($\frac{1}{4}$ cent) of sales and use tax.
- ❑ If a reduction were to be phased in, $\frac{1}{4}$ cents could equal roughly \$5-6 million annually for our taxpayers to reinvest in another purpose.
